Security Zones and Controlled Perimeters

Security Zones and Controlled Perimeters

- o Establish the Zone to be Secured
- o Become Familiar with the Physical Make-up of the Area in Question
- o Catalog People and Their Routine Activities in and around the Secured Zone
- o Control all Access Areas of the Secured Zone
- o Implement Security Architecture and Technology
- o Station Security Personnel
- o Eliminate Surveillance Blind Spots
- o Routinely Drill for Perimeter Security Breaches



Maintain Control of all Subject(s) Movement during Search Procedure

- o Create a Standard Order of Operations
- o Utilize Architecture to Control the Flow and Movement of Subjects
- o Provide a Strong Physical Appearance with Uniformed Security Personnel, Architecture, and Technology to Eliminate Non-compliance of Subjects



Collect Profile Data (PD) of all Subjects Gaining Entry into the Secured Zone

- o PD Maintains a Precise Subject Entry Roster
- o PD Helps Assess Security Risks Based on Previously Established Profiles
- o PD Discourages Some Questionable Subjects from Entering a Secured Zone

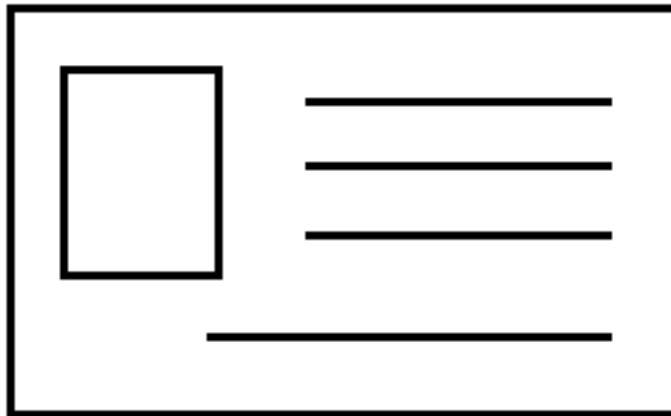

Physical Search of Subject Procedure

Subject's ID

- o Reconfirm the subject's identity and destination.
- o Make Sure the subject,s ID is Real
- o Issued by a Recognized Government Agency
- o Containing: Photo of Subject, Name, Address, Birthdate, Signature, Physical Description, ETC.



- o Invite the subject to consent to a search of person and property.

Search of Personal Effects

- o Ask the subject to empty the contents of his or her pockets into a designated container.
- o Have the subject open each of his or her bags and empty the contents.
- o Carefully and methodically sift through every section.
- o Always be looking for sharp objects.
- o Assess the contents and determine if there are any items out of the ordinary in relation to the subject's destination.
- o Keep all items a safe distance from the subject during the pat-down.

Metal Detector Search

- o Allow the subject to maintain a comfortable area of personal space.
- o Ask the subject if he or she has any weapons in his or her possession.
- o With the metal-detector, Start at the subject,s head and work down, scanning every plane of the subject,s body.



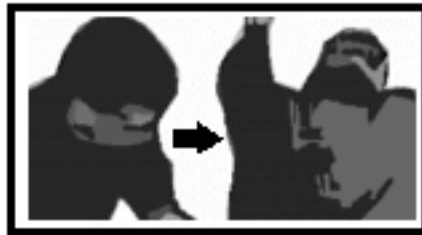
Physical Pat-down

- o Ask the subject to run his or her fingers through their hair.
- o Alert the subject that you will begin a pat-down prior to touching him or her.
- o Talk the subject through the pat-down, calling out each area prior to brushing.
- o Start with the head and work down
- o Brush the back of your hand firmly along every plane of the subject's body.



- o Watch the subject's body language.

- o They may flinch in certain areas, which may indicate a weapon.



- o If you find something, ask the subject to identify and slowly reveal the item.

- o Men should always search men.

- o Women should always search women.

- o Ask subject to do Self-Administered Oral DNA Test.

- o Be sure to thank the subject for his or her cooperation.
